Fall 2019 Recruitment – Phase 2 DUE within 48 hrs of the start of new member education

Chapters that have completed recruitment events must next complete the **2019-2020 Request for Recruitment Phase 2** in UIC Connection within 48 hours of the start of new member education:

- (1) Complete both PAPER documents with required signatures & UINs:
- ** Immediately during the very first meeting of your selected new members, ensure every new member signs the paper copy of BOTH forms listed below:
- Phase 2 Aspirant Anti-Hazing Policy Compliance Form [PDF attached]
- Phase 2 Verification of Aspirants Form [PDF attached]
- (2) <u>Upload both completed documents into the **2019-2020 Request for Recruitment Phase 2** *Form* in UIC Connection:</u>

- ** The above steps must be completed within 48 hours of the start of new member education, i.e., 48 hours from the conclusion of the first new member meeting. This due date is based on the date you previously submitted in Phase 1 as the actual start to your own chapter's new member education the first full gathering in a new member meeting you host. Grades and conduct checks are made from those on the new member list now associated with your organization.
 - Failure to submit this information at this critical starting point of your new member education
 period could put your chapter in jeopardy of holding future meetings with new members and/or
 suspension of your intake/new member process.

New Members in *Campus Save* Training – New Member Educators sign-up

What is **Campus Save** training?

The Campus Save Act is an update to the Clery Act, expanding the scope of important federal legislation in terms of reporting, response, and prevention education requirements around domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. To bring this crucial conversation to students in the FSL community, UIC implemented *Campus Save* training, a workshop facilitated by the Campus Advocacy Network (CAN), in the Women's Leadership and Resource Center. It is required for all new fraternity and sorority members at UIC.

When does Campus Save training take place and how do I sign up my new members?

- Trainings to select from, for your new members, will take place:

TUESDAYS: October 1, October 8, October 15, October 22, October 29, November 5, November 12, November 19, November 26, and December 3, 5:30-7:30pm

- All sessions take place in the Campus Advocacy Network (CAN) office, 1101 W. Taylor St., in their 3rd floor space (except for October 29, which will take place in an SCE meeting room TBD).
- 1) Have your chapter's New Member Educator send an email directly to <u>uicgreek@uic.edu</u> with the subject line, "Campus Save Sign-up" + your chapter's name.
- 2) Include in that email **two preferred dates** from the above list of available Tuesday nights for your new member class to attend.
- 3) Attached to your email must be a list of the new members attending, including name and UIC email.
- 4) FSL will respond back to you, indicating where your new members have been matched and placed for the correct training date, based on matching up preferences/openings we have each week.
