New Members in Campus Save Training – New Member Educators sign-up

What is **Campus Save** training?

The Campus Save Act is an update to the Clery Act, expanding the scope of important federal legislation in terms of reporting, response, and prevention education requirements around domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. To bring this crucial conversation to students in the FSL community, UIC implemented *Campus Save* training, a workshop facilitated by the Campus Advocacy Network (CAN), in the Women's Leadership and Resource Center.

It is required for all new fraternity and sorority members at UIC.

When does **Campus Save** training take place and how do I sign up my new members?

-If your organization is still selecting new members, and/or has made selections but has not submitted preferences for new members this fall 2019, please look at the dates ahead:

TUESDAY Evenings with spaces remaining... November 5 (male identified fraternity new members), November 26, and December 3, 5:30-7:30pm

- All sessions take place in the Campus Advocacy Network (CAN) office, 1101 W. Taylor St., in their 3rd floor space.

- 1) Have your chapter's New Member Educator send an email directly to uicgreek@uic.edu with the subject line, "Campus Save Sign-up" + your chapter's name.
- 2) Include in that email **two preferred dates** from the above list of available Tuesday nights for your new member class to attend.
- 3) Attached to your email must be a list of the new members attending, including name and UIC email.
- 4) FSL will respond back to you, indicating where your new members have been matched and placed for the correct training date, based on matching up preferences/openings we have each week.
