Dear FSL Leaders,

On this Halloween Day, and every day, let us pause to remind ourselves and one another of the intrinsic value that each of us brings to our community. We serve as transformative change agents to ensure respect, equity, and justice for all. Let us be ever mindful of the harmful and extremely inappropriate practices of cultural appropriation, particularly when costuming/Halloween activities take center stage:

What is cultural appropriation?

- 1. The taking from a culture that is not one's own of intellectual property, cultural expressions or artifacts, history and ways of knowledge (Ziff & Rao, 1997).
- 2. Any instance in which means commonly associated with and/or perceived as belonging to another are used to further one's own ends (Shugart, 1997).
- 3. To take parts (symbols, artifacts, dress, words, practices, etc.) from a culture that is not your own. This can happen in a variety of forms, but often around Halloween, it involves wearing "costumes" that rely on specific cultural signifiers.
- 4. A particular power dynamic in which members of a dominant culture take elements from a culture of people who have been systematically oppressed by that dominant group.

By continuing to treat cultural costumes as just another piece of clothing found in a store, we perpetuate the existing systemic power dynamic between the dominant culture and the cultures of marginalized identities. *In our UIC FSL community, we stand resolutely together to proactively eliminate the use of costumes, clothing, and artifacts as a simple commodity.*

Thank you to each of you for actively working to raise awareness, report concerning incidents, and create a system of change surrounding Halloween costumes, practices, and celebrations. Together, we will create a better sense of belonging, fostering a respectful and inclusive community for all.
