What is Campus Save training?

The Campus Save Act is an update to the Clery Act, expanding the scope of important federal legislation in terms of reporting, response, and prevention education requirements around domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, and stalking. To bring this crucial conversation to students in the FSL community, UIC implemented *Campus Save* training, a workshop facilitated by the Campus Advocacy Network (CAN), in the Women's Leadership and Resource Center.

It is required for all new fraternity and sorority members at UIC.

When does **Campus Save** training take place and how do I sign up my new members? -If your organization is still selecting new members, and/or has made selections but has not submitted preferences for new members this fall 2019, please look at the dates ahead:

- All sessions take place in the Campus Advocacy Network (CAN) office, 1101 W. Taylor St., in their 3rd floor space (*except for October 29*, which will take place in SCE Room 605, with a 5:45pm start time).
